Day 2: Tuesday, 9th September 2025 – Visit to Amazeum

On this day, students visited the Amazeum Children's Museum, located on the 2nd floor of The Pavilion Mall, SB Road, Pune. The museum is designed for children aged 6 months to 15 years and features engaging hands-on exhibits in science, art, and physical play. It encourages exploration through interactive exhibits, offers STEM-focused activities that make learning fun, and provides customizable experiences—guided tours, workshops, and self-exploration—ensuring students gain both knowledge and enjoyment in a safe environment.


joy of expression.
